A message from the HOA President

We are celebrating 30 years as the Montreux Homeowners' Association (HOA)! Montreux was established as a homeowners' association on June 14, 1991. Over the last three decades, our neighborhood has evolved. Trees are bigger, infrastructure is older, many of the original residents have moved, and new homeowners have joined our community.

One thing has not changed: the importance of your involvement in keeping our homeowner's association and neighborhood strong and vibrant. There are 242 homes in Montreux. Each year, 10 or so volunteers are needed to fill Board of Director positions, volunteering their time and talent to serve the HOA. Not everyone has the time or interest for that level of involvement. So how can *you* contribute?

- Attend the Annual General Meeting (only 1.5 hours once each year)
- Cast your ballot for the HOA Board of Directors (5 minutes of your time)
- Observe a monthly board meeting (1.5 hours)

- Talk with one (or more) of the board members to learn about their role
- If possible, volunteer for a board position
