Ponds & Stormwater Report

Frank Yandrasits

Bullfrogs

- American Bullfrogs are an invasive species.
- They have been in Montreux for years. There seem to be higher numbers this year.
- They are very loud, particularly at night, and some lake residents want them removed.
- The Board's response to a homeowner's demand last August:

Bullfrogs were not introduced by the Montreux HOA. The Board does not have a policy of protecting this species. The Board is not aware of any law requiring homeowners or homeowners' associations to actively eradicate this species.

- A couple homeowners have offered to help.
- Recommendation: Schedule time during the July Board meeting to review proposal(s).

Bullfrogs

- Dually classified as both "Prohibited" and "Wild Animal" (Reference WAC 220-440-020), so recreational harvest methods apply.
- Per **WAC 220-416-120 Bullfrogs**: It is unlawful to take bullfrogs except by angling, hand dip netting, spearing (gigging) or with bow and arrow. There is no daily limit on the number of bullfrogs that may be taken, no possession limit, and no size restrictions.
- Trapping bullfrogs is prohibited unless a case-specific permit is issued. Per WDFW, they would not issue a permit in this situation because it does not involve 'vetted scientists with secure facilities or is part of a WDFW monitoring/control program'.

Bullfrog Proposal(s)

- 1. Grant an exception to the CC&Rs for homeowners abutting the lakes to enable them to harvest bullfrogs per **WAC 220-416-120** along their property, or on neighboring property with permission. For example:
- CC&R 5.14 Weapons. No firearms of any kind or nature, including bows, slingshots, BB guns, or any other like weapon, shall be fired within the Property except by appropriate governmental officials in pursuit of their law enforcement duties.
- 2. Authorize the use of a Wildlife Control Officer (WCO) hired to harvest bullfrogs in compliance with WAC 220-416-120.
 - Hiring homeowner submits plan to Board for approval.
 - Board to grant access to the 10-foot easement* and the HOA common areas (including

the ponds).

- Communicate in advance with impacted lake residents.
 - 3. Other proposals?

- -Frank presented information from the Ponds and Stormwater Report (attached) about the bullfrogs in the Montreux lakes.
- -Discussion about the bullfrog issue ensued.
- -A motion was made by Joyce Stewart to enable homeowners to control bullfrogs using any legal method (reference WAC 229-416-120 Bullfrogs) that does not violate our CC&Rs (i.e. angling, hand dip netting or gigging) in the lake along their property or neighboring property with their neighbor's permission. Homeowners may hire a Wildlife Control Operator (WCO) with prior HOA Board approval to control bullfrogs. The approved plan must be communicated to affected lake residents in advance. If bullfrogs are taken in any other manner, a case specific permit must be obtained from Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) and presented to the Board for approval. Any associated costs are the responsibility of the hiring homeowner(s).

The motion was seconded by Jerry Lilly. The vote carried.

Code of Ethics – Frank Yandrasits

Frank presented a draft version of a Code of Ethics for Montreux Board Members (attached).

Board Member Code of Ethics

April Board Meeting Decision: Document "code of ethics" for Board members.

The Montreux Homeowners' Association ("Association") Board of Directors ("Board") is comprised of homeowners who volunteer their time in service to the Association.

All Montreux homeowners – and certainly officers, directors, and committee members – are responsible for complying with the Association's governing documents:

- Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, Restrictions and Easements,
- Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws,
- any adopted Rules and Regulations.

Officers and directors are not just entrusted by their fellow homeowners to act in the best interests of the Association, but they are also dutybound to do so.

Board Member Code of Ethics

Proposal

To help meet the pledge of trust and fulfill their duty, all officers, directors, and chairpersons are expected to follow a "code of ethics" associated with their responsibility on the Board.

Review these expectations at the start of each new Board term:

Duty of Loyalty

• Act fairly, in good faith, and for the benefit of the Association as a whole.

- Avoid acting where there is a conflict of interest. Disclose any potential conflicts or
 - personal interest and recuse themselves from the discussion and vote in case one exists.
- Protect personal information about any homeowner, resident, or employee.
- Board members will NOT
 - o exploit their position on the Board for personal gain,
 - accept gifts from suppliers or contractors,
 - o disclose confidential information to any party outside the Board unless authorized to do so,
 - use association funds for personal use.

Board Member Code of Ethics Proposal

Duty of Care

- Act in a prudent and reasonable manner.
- ➤ Make informed decisions for the association using sound judgment and due diligence.

This includes seeking and following the advice of subject matter experts, as necessary. ➤ Stay up to date on the association's rules and regulations.

Scope of authority

➤ Perform their duties within the scope of authority as determined by the association's governing documents and the law.

Board and Committee members will also:

- Treat everyone with respect. They will not threaten, intimidate, or harass any board member, homeowner, resident, contractor, or employee.
- Allow community members the chance to voice their opinions on association matters.
- Support the decisions made as a board even if they do not necessarily agree with them.
