
Montreux Waterfalls

August 14, 2024, HOA Board Meeting




- The waterfalls are still working fine since the repair of the large falls pump last October.
- Last year the falls consumed 59,051
 gallons of water in July. This year
 year we only used only 33,783 gallons
 over the same period. Annual water
 consumption is down 64% this year
 compared to last year at this time.
- The water level sensor for the large falls was acting up, but worked perfectly during June and July.

- The waterfalls were pressure washed on Friday, July 12, by Rodriguez Irrigation. The cost was \$1,800 plus tax. This is the exact cost we paid last year. Enrique's crew did a great job and the falls look better than ever.
- The Sensaphone monitoring system's annual subscription was renewed in July for \$419.40.
- Horsetail have returned to the large falls again and Jerry plans to remove them soon.



A message from the HOA President

Hello, my name is Joyce Stewart - your newly elected Association president

Before retiring in 2019. I worked as a teacher, elementary principal, and middle school principal. I ended my career as deputy superintendent in a large and diverse school district. Even though my career was filled with some challenging and difficult moments, I smile each time I think of those 40 years working in service of students and their families in three different states
