Brief Update Regarding Formal Complaint Shared at the October meeting (nuisance by shining their outdoor lighting at our home)

City Responses:

- Do the existing outdoor lantern lights at the entrance to every house need to be extinguished from 10pm – 6am? The City's response, "The short answer is no."
- Does a homeowner have to follow the "dark sky" ordinance by turning their outdoor patio lights off from 10 pm-6 am even if the homeowner received approval from the City prior to the adoption of the code? City's response- " They aren't required by the City to turn outdoor lights off from 10pm-6am for dark sky hours."
- "Existing lighting on single family homes does not need to comply with 18.610.050 (A) (9) or 18.601.070 Prohibited Outdoor Lighting, but any new lighting does."

- ☐ Attended an Issaquah Middle Housing Open House on Oct 22 (HB 1110 and HB 1337)
 - Confirmed that our HOA CCRs stating lots are for single family homes only supersede the new legislation
- Trees
 - Held discussion with Daniel Martinez (Issaquah City Planner) to clarify tree replacement requirements. Hazard trees must be replaced at least 1:1 but possibly 1:2 if the tree density is low on a lot. This helps two in process homeowners as they only have to plant 2 trees to replace the one removed
 - Future rule will be clarified to be 1:1 replacement (2025)
 - Contacted by Minnie Dhaliwal, Community Planning & Development Director. We will have a discussion in December about future tree requirement plans (Thanks to Zach Hall of the City Council for the connection)
 - Will be contacting Zach Hall regarding visiting the two lots with hazard tree removals

NGPE Report

Montreux is surrounded by a Native Growth Protection Easement (NGPE). As owners, we are obligated to leave trees and other vegetation undistributed within the NGPE unless approved by the City of Issaquah. The Montreux H works with the city to obtain approval of any needed work this area. About every three (3) years, the HOA contracts a certified arborist to assess the areas of the NGPE where trees exast that are in stirking distance of owners' propertie Trees are identified by category for potential of risk if they Depending on the level of risk, the HOA then contracts will company to remove the potential risk within the time perior recommended by the certified arborist.
