- With 0.0" of rain in July and air temperatures exceeding 80 degrees 12 of the 31 days, the falls used 20,620 gallons of water which is 39% lower than last July and 75% lower than July 2023.
- The \$419 annual maintenance fee for the Sensaphone monitoring system was renewed on July 17. Also, the backup battery for the system will soon be replaced by WE electric.

### NGPE Report

Montreux is surrounded by a Native Growth Protection Easement (NGPE). As owners, we are obligated to leave trees and other vegetation undistributed within the NGPE unless approved by the City of Issaquah. The Montreux H works with the city to obtain approval of any needed work this area. About every three (3) years, the HOA contracts a certified arborist to assess the areas of the NGPE where trees exist that are in striking distance of owners' pro Trees are identified by category for potential of risk if they were to fall from such things as windstorms or decay.

Depending on the level of risk, the HOA then contracts wi company to remove the potential risk within the time period recommended by the certified arborist.

The most recent assessment was completed in early May The HOA is currently taking action to have the high risk trees removed of by mid-
